- 2. Principal's Report (7:06)
  - a. Indigenous Land Acknowledgement:

 Acknowledge that we are situated on the unceded traditional territories of the xwməθkwəyəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations.

#### b. Halloween Event:

- Thank you to all the volunteers for all of their effort and work. Within one
  week, volunteers pulled off an amazing, fun, community building event. It was
  a full house, the kids and parents had a great time, and it was great to see
  everyone pitch in!
- Special thanks to Lorie, our awesome PAC chair who got things rolling; Tim
  who led the Haunted House with students and parent volunteers; Julia for
  leading the musical cakes; Kelly and Denise for all their work; Nolan for
  creating the trophy. Far too many people to name. It was amazing to see
  everyone come together.

## c. Thank you to Volunteers:

- Thank you to all the parents who have been helping out in the school. It is nice to see people in the building again! We have veggie helpers, sushi helpers, and pizza will be starting up again soon.
- Special thanks to Kelly and Scott and the grade 7 student sushi lunch helpers.

### d. Student and Family Affordability Fund:

- New fund for 2022 to support families this year. \$60 million one-time funding to school districts for food security and affordability concerns.
- VSB has been allocated \$4,712,638. Funds must be spent by June 30 2023. Two categories:
- 1. Food and Nutritional support: no overhead spending. For students and families. Targeted spending to support students and families and universal spending. E.g. food hampers, gift cards for grocery stores, nutrition snacks, learning experiences, nutritional snacks for students at recess and breaks.
- 2. Hardships: Family assistance targeted and universal. E.g. (targeted): clothing, shoes, dental work etc.; (universal): waiving fees etc.
- LEB received \$35,000.
- Working group with staff members to decide how to use this
- Put money aside for food, sushi, pizza etc.
- Look at bringing in Grain de Chef cooking lessons
- Put money aside for families in need for target family assistance
- Universal pending: the majority of funds will go there. Thinking of giving each student \$/each division \$/looking at something school-wide and division-wide. It's going to be gone June 30th 2023 if not used.

#### Q&A:

- Q: re: our sister school Grandview. In general we are privileged, is there any way we can gift this money?
- A: we will need to submit numbers. In March if they come back to say to us
  that we are spending, then we can look at gifting funds. We were also
  assured that other tiers got substantially more funding and there is a separate
  pot for aboriginal children. Also keep in mind Art Card money goes directly to
  our sister school.
